

Tealby Class B1 c.1162 - c.1163

Moneyer HENRI

Class B2, B3, & B4 are not recorded at the Bury St Edmunds mint

Class B1 sits somewhat uncomfortably between class A and C. The moneyer Willem struck coins in class A and C but the only set of dies recorded from class B1 has Henri as the moneyer. This indicates that the final dies of class A, the early dies of class B and the early dies of class C overlapped

Diagnostic features of this class B1 outlined in red

The design (folds) of the mantel is the main difference between busts A1 and A2. However it is very rare to see all of these features on the majority of the coins.

As in class A' no hair either side of portrait

Trefoils of pellets between two fold of mantle

Some combination of jewels remain on the king's left shoulder and arm
